Lose the paper or go bust

Only paper-free operations will be acceptable in the future warns German community system

NYBODY who fails to embrace e-freight will lose their competitive edge, eventually putting their business at risk, warns the pioneering company behind the Port of Hamburg's flourishing and totally paperless communications system, writes Thelma Etim.

Dakosy was established in 1982 when the freight forwarding companies, shipping lines and container terminals at the busy German port of Hamburg formed a Port Community System (PCS).

It was born out of their frustration with a slow, outmoded operation that did not lend itself to any pre-planning, so documentation always arrived together with the freight container and couriers crowded the infrastructure.

The new concept was simple and effective: eradicate the 'paper mountain' and speed up the process by introducing an electronic network where data is exchanged between all the parties involved.

People within the sea freight industry had always exchanged such information but it was usually between just two entities. For




- Reciprocal availability for market researches and field studies, to be invoiced at purchasing cost (or even made free of charge, depending on the entity, evaluated on a time by time basis). The studies should be other purely tradeentioned.
- Reciprocal logal assistance offered to the members of the associations at pure cost, including illuster activities, translation services, direct assistance. The service shall be provided by making use, whorever required and deemed necessary, of professional law firms, which have a corporate assemblement surrect.
- Reciprocal availability of "working desks" within the associations' promises for visiting officers or members. The desks shall be made available, free of charge up to 25wo units of a single time and up to 15 working desp
- such as relitrooms, coffee rooms and meeting sooms (upon availability).

 Reciprocal prevision for visibility and advertisement (such as the publication of the twinning agreement assement or of the twin-association logics on boards,
- Reciprocal availability for professional training and slages for the members of the twin association, to be held also in cooperation with the local University and other institutions. This service shall include the provision for working desks within the escociations' premises (one with at a single time and up to 30 days
- Reciprocal visits of association officers to be scheduled once a year, whishall include—on request—guided fours to accessible logistic facilities (such port terminals, etc) and institutional meeting.


